



INTER Horizontal

Geographically speaking, humanity has always shared a sense of closeness: our communities, nations, and cultures are rooted in the land we inhabit. From the earliest human migrations across continents to the rise of cities and civilizations, geography has shaped our identities, interactions, and understanding of the world around us. The physical distances that separate us are now blurred by technology, but the heart of our connection remains anchored in the spaces we share, whether urban or rural.

The internet, once hailed as the herald of global communication, seems to increasingly accentuate differences and cause us to withdraw into ourselves.

Yet we remain connected to our fellow citizens of the world, beyond borders and cultural and political agreements. We can revitalize this horizontal connection through art.

INTER Vertical

Over time, people have forged bonds between generations, preserving the traditions, knowledge, and stories that connect us to the past while propelling us toward the future. We are all part of a continuous thread, influenced by those who came before us and shaping the world that future generations will inherit. Through written history, oral traditions, art, and innovation, each generation adds layers to humanity's collective experience, forming a complex network that connects us across time.

Modern advances, from the internet to advanced transportation, have allowed people to transcend geographical and temporal boundaries. Today, a message sent in one part of the world can reach the other side in an instant, and a few clicks are all it takes to learn about events that occurred hundreds or even thousands of years ago. Although technology may seem to distance us from one another, it also improves our understanding of our shared history and the interconnectedness of humanity, reinforcing the reality that we are, in fact, united across space and time.

Thus, geography and time are no longer limitations, but bonds that unite us, shaping a world, where distance and time no longer separate us, but where our stories continually intertwine.

Description

As a curator, my mission is not only to present works of art, but also to weave stories that resonate with our collective humanity. This exhibition explores the complex ties that bind people together, both geographically and across time, using art as a means to highlight this omnipresent connection.

8 international artists join hands and minds to create an exhibition featuring works of art in all disciplines (painting, drawing, sculpture, installation, etc.) on the theme of INTER. Each work expresses its own message, draws on its own symbols, and becomes universal.

Throughout history, art has been a reflection of these geographies—a canvas for telling the story of our environments, our struggles, and our triumphs. The works you will discover here span several continents, but they all have one thing in common: the artist's response to their world, whether it be the landscape, urban development, or the communities that surround them.

Our connection to time is equally fascinating. Art, like a time capsule, serves as a bridge between the past, present, and future. It allows us to engage with the echoes of history, to reflect on moments past while inspiring those to come. This exhibition presents works spanning different eras, highlighting how themes of connection, migration, identity, and culture persist across centuries. The artists I present are both historians and visionaries, capturing moments of their time while speaking to our collective experience as human beings.
